SAPA Membership Spotlight – Mayday Levine Mata

I came to Tucson in 2004, as a SAPIC intern, under the supervision of Eric Schindler (Training Director), Karl, Pat Penn and Sandi Gallagher. I fell in love with Tucson within my first month, in spite of the move from NH and seeing my lab-retriever mix (the consummate water dog) wilt in the scorching heat. I remember when I decided to move to Tucson permanently, the supervisors

"hooraying," which felt really good, but another PhD person advising me "don't move to Tucson, there are no opportunities for psychologists." I loved Tucson so much that I was willing to risk ignoring her advice, however, it freaked the hell out of me!

My first post-doctoral position was as an Intake Clinician at a big Community Mental Health where I was paid \$31,000/year. Yikes! Too much blood, sweat and debt for that pay! Within 8 months, however, I was promoted to supervisor of the Therapy Team and though I had many sleepless nights (which I now realize is developmentally appropriate), I grew to love public health and its intersection with psychology.

Fast-forward 12 years from that position, and after stints with three other agencies (Custody Mediator/Evaluator with Pima County Superior Court, Program Director at Sierra Tucson and Chief Clinical Officer at CPSA), I am back to Community Mental Health and wearing a few hats. As Training Director for our APA Accredited Internship (SAPIC), Director of Integrated Child and Family Services, and Director of both Adult and Children's Therapy Teams, I can truly say my professional life is stimulating, rewarding, rich and busy and I feel that I have totally proven the PhD who told me Tucson had little to offer psychologists – WRONG!

Through all of this, however, I have been beyond lucky to develop strong, supportive, and fun collegial relationships with many of my colleagues – in no small part to SAPA. I honestly cannot remember how I learned about and joined SAPA, though I suspect it was encouraged by Sandi Gallagher, Eric Schindler or Pat Penn. Somehow, however, I ended up being a Member at Large, in 2008 and then in a moment of energy and ignorance, agreed to be president elect. I remember being impressed by the professional diversity in the room: Eric Schindler, CEO of Child and Family Resources was president and Sandi Gallagher, VA psychologist was his President-Elect. Julie Feldman was the Academic Chair Member and other members included: Laura Schnapps (private practice), Holly Joubert (residential treatment), Roxana Samaniego (academic at that time) and Gustavo Perez (I believe in the schools at that time), and more.

The confirming moment for me and the beauty of all that SAPA has to offer was at the Holiday Party during which the president recognizes the board. I have a distinct memory of Larry Morris, Marty Levy, and Ken Marsh sitting, wedged in on a little couch, giggling, laughing and just enjoying each other and I thought "That. That's what I want with my colleagues — to know and enjoy them 20 (really 40 — but I don't want angry emails from those three) years later. It was a moment of insight about how we are connected in deep in meaningful ways, and how the support, trust and appreciation for our colleagues gets us through this complicated and challenging work.


